Teachers: Please distribute to each WMEA All-State student.

Congratulations! Your outstanding audition has earned you a spot in one of the WMEA All-State Honor Groups in Spokane! As a member of one of these select groups, you must take several steps to secure your spot. Please carefully review this information with your family and teacher, paying particular attention to the registration and fee payment deadlines.

Registration and Payment of Fees

Carefully complete your registration form, obtain all required signatures, and return it to your school music teacher immediately.

The registration fee is **\$340.**

Many schools assist students with the cost of participation. ASBs, booster clubs, or other local organizations may be willing to help you. If you applied for a scholarship from the *Young Musicians Excelling* fund, that scholarship has been applied, and your teacher will tell you how much remains to be paid.

All fees must be paid in one of the following ways:

1. Processed through your school or district by Check, Purchase Order, or purchasing card;
2. Paid by credit card through a link your teacher can send to your parents/guardians.

If you are expected to fund *part* of your participation expense personally, you must pay the school, which will then pay WMEA. WMEA will not accept partial or split payments.

Registration and payment must be postmarked by December 6. Late registrations will be charged an additional \$20 per student.

If a student has to withdraw after payment of registration fees, a progressive refund policy is in place: \$220 if withdrawn between December 1 and 31; \$120 if withdrawn between January 1 and 31.

No refunds will be given after February 1.

Music

The music you are to play will be mailed to your school music teacher beginning in the first week of January. Note: We will not mail music until all registrations are received and your school pays all fees.

Once your music has arrived, label all loose pages in pencil with your name and school. Contact your school music teacher immediately if you believe you have received the wrong music or parts.

Once you receive your music, your job is to **practice!** You will have one and a half days of rehearsal before the performance, so you must know your part well by the time you arrive in mid-February.

Attendance, Participation, and Behavior

By electing to participate in WMEA All-State, you, your parents, and your teacher agree that you will not leave rehearsal or other activities between check-in and the end of the concert. Doing so will result in your removal from the group.

On the registration form, students, parents, teachers, and the school principal sign to agree to the following:

All students are expected to follow common-sense guidelines of good behavior at all times. Rowdiness, destruction or defacing of property, use of alcohol or illegal drugs, or any other inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated. Students are expected to follow the instructions of all adult supervisors at rehearsal, in transit, or in any other location. Students **MUST** be at all rehearsals and with the group for the entire scheduled time. Any student leaving without prior permission from the appropriate group manager will be disqualified from further participation in WMEA All-State activities and sent home at the first opportunity at their expense. We, the undersigned, understand and will abide by this. Permission is granted for this student's name and/or picture to appear on recordings, in video, and in photographs.

Parents, family, friends, and teachers are welcome to observe rehearsals throughout the day except for the closed sound checks, which will occur between 12:00 and 4:00 PM. Chaperones are not required to be present during rehearsals or WMEA-provided meals.

What to Wear and Bring

Rehearsal Attire: Please wear comfortable, school-appropriate clothing for rehearsals during the day.

Concert Attire: Please bring either your regular school ensemble concert attire OR "concert black," with dark shoes and socks.

Instruments: Please bring all instruments and related accessories required (reeds, mutes, mouthpieces, valve or slide oil, cork grease, reed cups, etc.)

Percussionists: Only larger instruments will be provided (timpani, bass drum, mallet instruments, chimes.) You must bring all **sticks, mallets, beaters, and any small percussion** items listed in your part (i.e., triangle, tambourine, clave, etc.)

Tuba players – please bring a concert Tuba, no Sousaphones.

Sheet Music: Please bring the folder with the sheet music that will be sent to your school.

Luggage should be clearly labeled with the student's name and school. Chaperones should plan to hold onto student luggage on Friday while students are in rehearsal. (Chaperones are free to leave during rehearsal and may check into hotels during the hotel's regular check-in period.)

Souvenirs and Memorabilia

All student participants will receive a t-shirt and one video recording. Pre-order forms for additional commemorative photos, plaques, t-shirts/sweatshirts, and recordings will be sent with sheet music and posted on the WMEA website at that time (after January 6).

Unfortunately, we still await information about **hotel blocks, concert tickets, and souvenir orders.** Please wait for a second info packet with more details about the following:

- **Concert tickets:**
 - Tickets for the **All-State Concert** on **Saturday, February 15, at 4:30 p.m.** will be **\$25** each and will be sold online.
 - Teachers will receive a link to purchase tickets to distribute to the families of performing students.
- **Hotels:**
 - WMEA has been working with downtown Spokane area hotels to hold designated room blocks for Honor Group students. Special booking links, codes, or other instructions are still forthcoming.
 - The **cutoff date** for making your reservation will vary by hotel, but it will generally be between **January 9 and 13**. After that date, any remaining rooms in our blocks will be released to the general public, and rates may increase.
 - **Note:** Another large event is in Spokane the same weekend, so rooms will be at a premium. When hotel information is published, please act on it ASAP. For schools paying for multiple student rooms, it may help to set up your payment information and be ready to simply fill in the amount and pay or send an open purchase order as soon as that information arrives.
 - **Hotels that will have room blocks are listed on the next page.** You can use this information to plan ahead, knowing that booking instructions and rates will be provided later.
- **Souvenir Orders:**
 - **All student participants will receive a t-shirt and one video recording.**
 - Pre-order forms for additional commemorative photos, plaques, t-shirts/sweatshirts, and recordings will be sent with sheet music and posted on the WMEA website at that time (after January 6).

- Teachers are responsible for reserving hotel rooms for all accepted students and arranging hotel payments through their school's financial processor.
- The following hotels have set aside room blocks for All-State and All-Northwest students.
- Schools are not required to use the hotels on this list; however, WMEA has negotiated discounted rates for rooms in these hotels, all within walking distance of rehearsal and concert sites. WMEA encourages teachers and chaperones to consider the transit time between honor group events and hotels and plan appropriately for students to arrive on time and ready to rehearse each day.
- Students living within the Spokane metro area *can* stay at home, provided their teacher has arranged adequate transportation with their parents or guardians. However, students are not permitted to drive themselves to or from Honor Group events.
- **An updated version of this list, including any codes, links, or other booking instructions, will be provided later. This is provided for information only. WMEA policy prohibits staff from arranging hotel rooms for students; this is the responsibility of teachers.**
